## Trail Closure Info as of September 18, 2023

Note: this information will quickly become out-of-date as trail repairs are completed and more trails open. Please refer to the webpages of the trail managing group for the latest information.

Generally, trails across the province could have debris, fallen trees or washouts. Many trails were closed in anticipation of the storm and may remain closed while trail managers assess damage.

Please stay off trails that are closed! This is for a number of reasons: it may be unsafe; going on them may cause further damage; or you could get in the way of repair or clean up efforts. The sooner repair crews can do their work without disruption, the sooner those trails will reopen.

The best and most up-to-date information on trails is from the body that manages the trail. Go online and search the trail name or group name and you'll find their website or facebook page with the latest updates.

We have a mix of who owns and manages trails in the province. There are trails found in municipal parks, provincial parks or protected areas or national parks (managed by municipal, provincial or federal government or sometimes a community group for some provincial properties). Then you have trails managed by volunteer run community groups. Community Groups whose trails have seen some damage are going to need donations and warm bodies to help repair and reopen trails.
